

The 2022 PGSF Application Process is now open.

Your students can apply at <u>https://www.pgsf.org/scholarship-application</u> Scholarships are available for Full-Time, Part-Time and Graduate Students. The Print and Graphics Scholarship Foundation (PGSF) is a not-forprofit, private industry directed organization that dispenses technical school, undergraduate and graduate fellowship assistance to men and women interested in a career in the graphic communications field. PGSF has two main missions. First, to attract young people to the industry and inform them (and their parents, school advisors, etc.) of the wide variety of career opportunities available. Second, if they are pursuing postsecondary education in order to enter the field, we provide financial assistance to them. The Foundation, along with its donors and sponsors, are working to build the future workforce of the graphic communications industry.

Selection of Finalists The Scholarship Selection Committee of PGSF is comprised of college educators and industry leaders experienced in interpreting test scores, school records, and other pertinent information. The confidential file of every candidate who becomes a semifinalist in the competition is carefully reviewed. Scholarship candidates are judged on the basis of their academic records; recommendations offered from instructors, advisors, and employers; biographical records, which indicate academic honors; extracurricular interests, etc.

Announcement of Winners A letter will notify scholarship winners. Each scholarship award becomes official when the winner returns a form that confirms enrollment in an approved college and the student's signature verifying acceptance of the scholarship. Failure of the student to return the signed acceptance will result in forfeiting of the scholarship.

Value of Awards Scholarship awards vary in amount from \$1,000 to \$5,000 per academic year, in most cases, for up to four years. PGSF students may post their resumes on printworkers.com for those who are seeking internships, part-time, or fill-time employment. The Managing Director of PGSF will determine the amount of each scholarship. The amount of the scholarship is not made public. The award will be paid in a lump sum directly to the college financial aid office, in the student's name. The college will be authorized to draw upon the grant for payment of tuition and other fees.

Scholarship Renewal A scholarship is awarded for up to four years of post-secondary education (unless otherwise specified) provided the recipient maintains a high scholastic average and continues in an approved program of study. The student's record is reviewed at the end of each grading period and, if satisfactory, the award is extended for the following year. Students are required to maintain a "B" (3.0) average. If a student's

grades fall below this average, the student will be put on academic probation for the following semester. if the student is below a 3.0 for two consecutive semesters the student loses the scholarship and must reapply.

Scholarships for Graduate Study Some fellowship (graduate study) awards are available for college graduates who want to pursue advanced training in some specialized areas that relate to the graphic communication/printing industry. Oklahoma Veterans Film Competition

DEAR INSTRUCTORS,

I'm contacting you on behalf of the **OKLAHOMA VETERANS FILM COMPETITION** (OVFC) to share an exciting community-friendly opportunity. Recently, CareerTech, in association with SkillsUSA and BPA, distributed flyers with information related to the veteran's film competition that you may or may not have received. The goal of this communication is to ensure that you have a chance to register your teams before the contest starts.

FILM CONTEST DATES:

* Competition opens Friday, October 1^{st,} and ends on Thursday, November 11 (Veterans Day) 2021.

(We understand this presents a very short window of time for a video so a number of support mechanisms are in place to aid help students with the production process. A couple of examples: (1) A list of local military

veterans will be made available; (2) students will have access to helpful short videos that provide tips, techniques, and a host of potential questions to ask veterans.)

BASIC SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- * Up to three student-member teams. (Two Divisions: High School & Post-Secondary School)
- * Must interview a living military veteran
- * Veterans must have a direct and personal Oklahoman connection
- * 5-7 minutes in duration
- * Narrative presentation of a living veteran's military service
- * Provide a digital copy of raw footage to veterans

Official Rules and a Contest Rubric will be released on the website on October 1, 2021. Judges for this competition are movie-industry producers, directors, and screenwriters as well as high-ranking military veterans. Each video will be viewed and evaluated based on the official rules and overall quality. At the end of the judging process, 3 High-School and Post Secondary School teams will be awarded 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place **Cash Prizes. Winning Teams and their instructors will also be publicly recognized and acknowledged for their participation in honoring Oklahoma veterans.**
