Chapter Display State Contest Information

Note Contest Locations Change

- Students who are setting up Displays must report to the Display Chairman at the Display area in the <u>2nd Floor Legacy Hall</u> at the Tulsa Convention Center from 11:00 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Sunday, April 23. Each school will register and draw for location of display.
- <u>Students will have from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. to set up Displays</u>. Display set-up is limited to three students per entry (NO ADVISORS WILL BE ALLOWED!).
- Displays requiring electrical service must bring their own extension cords. Displays requiring tables will need to bring their own tables.
- <u>Judging will take place at 1:30 p.m.</u> One student for each Display must be present for an interview during the judging (see SkillsUSA Technical Standards). All contestants will be required to submit a one page, typed resume. If any contestant does not submit a resume to the contest chair, penalty points will be assessed.
- Displays will be left up for viewing on Monday, April 24.
- Students are encouraged to stay with displays to allow viewers to visit with them during 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Monday. *This is a great time to showcase the student's talent and an opportunity for students to talk about their school, instructor, program, and the skills.*
- Displays must be removed between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Monday. SkillsUSA IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DISPLAYS WHICH ARE NOT PICKED UP BY 5:00 P.M. on Monday.
- Winners will be announced during the General Session on **Monday, April 24** at 7:00 p.m. in the Tulsa Convention Center Grand Hall. First, second, and third place Displays will receive a team trophy and **three** medallions. Please inform your students and select three contestants who will come to the stage to receive the award.
- Official SkillsUSA attire is required. "For men: Official red blazer or jacket, black dress slacks, white dress shirt, plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA tie, black socks and black shoes. For women: Official red blazer or jacket, black dress slacks or skirt (knee length), with businesslike white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black shoes." Any contestant winner who is not in official SkillsUSA attire will not be permitted on stage, but will be escorted behind stage to receive his/her medallion and awards.
