Skill Contest – The State SkillsUSA Welding Sculpture Skill Championships will be held on **Sunday, April 24**, at the Tulsa Convention Center in the <u>2nd Floor Legacy Hall</u>.

Contestant Resumes All contestants will be required to submit a typed resume. If any contestant does not submit a resume to the contest chair, penalty points will be assessed.

Judging will take place at 1:30 p.m. No students will be allowed in judging area during this time.

PUBLIC VIEWING

- Displays will be left up for viewing on Monday, April 25.
- Students are encouraged to stay with displays to allow viewers to visit with them during 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. This is a great time to showcase the student's talent and an opportunity for students to talk about their school, instructor, program and the skills they have learned with visitors.
- Displays must be removed between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. SkillsUSA IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DISPLAYS WHICH ARE NOT PICKED UP BY 5:00 P.M. ON MONDAY.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from the contest site must be provided by the instructor or other school official. There **will not** be any shuttles provided at any time during this conference.

DINNER and LUNCH

There will be no lunch or dinner provided during the competition. Students may want to bring money for drinks and snacks out of the vending machines.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS

As in the past, skill contestants will not be penalized for not adhering to national clothing requirements. Contestants should **not** wear clothing that has school identification visible to the judges.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Contest winners will be recognized during the **Awards Assembly at 7:00 a.m. on Monday, April 24** in the Grand Hall of the Tulsa Convention Center. Official SkillsUSA attire is required. According to the SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards - official clothing requirements are as follows: "*For men:* SkillsUSA official attire: Official red blazer or jacket, black trousers, white dress shirt, plain black tie with no pattern or official SkillsUSA tie, black socks and black shoes. *For women:* Official red blazer or jacket, black dress slacks or skirt, with businesslike white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes." Any contest winner who is not in official SkillsUSA attire will not be permitted on stage. The student will be escorted behind the stage to receive his or her medallion and awards.
