CONTEST FEES

In addition to the regular conference registration, there will be a contest fee of **\$20.00 per contestant**. This charge is included in the contest registration fee.

DATE, TIME and LOCATION

Online Testing – The Professional Development and written exams will be given online from March 15 - April 7, 2023.

Skill Contest

The 2023 State SkillsUSA Motorcycle Service Technology Contest will be held on Monday, April 24th. The contest will be held at Central Tech-Drumright.

Registration will begin at 8:00 a.m. and the contest will start promptly at 8:30 a.m.

Contestant Resumes – All contestants will be required to submit a typed resume. If any contestant does not submit a resume to the contest chair, penalty points will be assessed.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from the contest site will not be available. You must make arrangements for transportation.

LUNCH

Contestants will have an hour off for lunch. They may go to lunch with their instructors.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS

As in the past, skill contestants will not be penalized for not adhering to national clothing requirements. Contestants should **not** wear clothing that has school identification visible to the judges. Those contestants wearing program uniforms will need to cover all identifying marks.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Contest winners will be recognized during the Awards Assembly on Tuesday, April 25th at the Tulsa Cox Convention Center in the Grand Hall at 9:00 a.m. Official SkillsUSA attire is required. According to the SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards- official clothing requirements are as follows: "For men: SkillsUSA official attire: Official red blazer or jacket, black trousers, white dress shirt, plain black tie with no pattern or official SkillsUSA tie, black socks, and black shoes. For women: Official red blazer or jacket, black dress slacks or skirt, with a businesslike white, collarless blouse or white blouse with a small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, black sheer or skin-tone hose and black dress shoes. Any contest winner who is not in official SkillsUSA attire will not be permitted on stage. The student will be escorted behind the stage to receive his or her medallion and awards.

INDUSTRY AWARDS

Each instructor will need to bring two prizes for each contest participant entered. Please coordinate your industry awards efforts through Steven Bradshaw. Industry awards should be labeled with the name and address of the award supplier, must be accompanied by an *industry award donation information sheet* (available on the Oklahoma SkillsUSA website) and be brought to the **awards area in the Conference Hall** at the Tulsa Convention Center on Monday, April 24th, between 8:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

Please make sure you have attached a business card to each industry award so that an appropriate "Thank you" may be sent. (Sample letters may be found on the Oklahoma SkillsUSA website)
