

Date, Time and Location of Contestant Meeting

The 2024 State SkillsUSA Pin Design Contest will be held on **Sunday, April 21** at Cox Convention Center, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Contestants must report to the Contest Chairman at the contest area in the <u> 2^{nd} Floor Legacy</u></u> <u>*Hall*</u> at 11:00 a.m. Set up will occur between 11:00am-1:00pm. Contest and interviews will start promptly at 1:30pm.

Clothing Requirements

Contestants MUST wear official SkillsUSA dress attire for contest. A clothing penalty will apply for any deviations from official dress. <u>Class A: SkillsUSA Official Attire or Class E: Competition</u> <u>Specific — Business Casual allowed.</u>

Equipment and Materials

- 1. Supplied by the technical committee:
 - a. Table space for each display
 - b. Timekeeper and judges
 - c. All necessary information for the judges and technical committee
- 2. Supplied by the competitor:

a. (2) 8.5" x 11" page rendering of pin design with two sizes: 7" and 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (must follow points in Competition Guidelines, including attribution for fair use and proof of creative commons content, or permission to use copyrighted content). One 8.5" x 11" rendering of pin design will be turned into judges.

b. Tabletop display to promote the pin design to the public

c. Means of presentation: computer, tablet, notebook, poster, or other media of the competitor's choice, if desired to make the presentation to the judges.

d. All competitors must create a one-page resume.

Contestant Resume

All contestants will be required to submit a one page, typed resume. If any contestant does not submit a resume to the contest chair, penalty points will be assessed.

Rules and Regulations

SkillsUSA (PDP) test will be taken on-line March 13-April 9. Students need to coordinate with testing centers on their campuses to complete testing.

Official outline of contest found on SkillsUSA Pin Design Technical Standard, found/accessed through Absorb.

- <u>Students (No Advisors) will have from 11:00 a.m. -1 p.m. to set up Pin Design Displays</u>. Display set-up is limited to three students per entry.
- Judging and interviews will take place starting at 1:30 p.m.

Contestants should be prepared to discuss how they come up with their design; their color scheme; and the overall process. They should bring with them all their preliminary work (sketches, layouts, etc.).

- Contestants will give a **5–7 minute presentation** regarding their design. Talking points should include: How they came up with their design, the process used in developing their design, what are the design's unique qualities and why should other students/advisors want to wear it?
- Students are encouraged to stay with displays to allow viewers to visit with them during 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on **Monday, April 22.** This is a great time to showcase the student's talent and an opportunity for students to talk about their school, instructor, program, and the skills.
- Displays must be removed between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday, April 22. SkillsUSA IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DISPLAYS WHICH ARE NOT PICKED UP BY 5:00 P.M.
- First, second and third place winners will be announced during the General Session on **Monday, April 22** at 7:00 p.m. in the Tulsa Convention Center Grand Hall.

Awards Ceremony

Contest winners will be recognized at the General Session on **Monday evening, April 22**, at 7:00 p.m. in the Tulsa Convention Center Grand Hall. Contest winners will not be allowed on stage if not in official dress.

For men: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks; white dress shirt; plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA black tie; black socks and black shoes.

For women: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks or knee-length skirt with businesslike white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes.
