

# Cabinetmaking State Contest Information

#### Tentative-Information is subject to change, check back often

#### Item 1 – Date, Time and Location

Contestant orientation will begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. at *Moore Norman Campus* in the Construction Trades program. All contestant materials will need to be unloaded at this time. *Contest will be held on <u>April 16, 2024</u>*.

IF YOU ARE GOING TO BRING INDUSTRY AWARDS BE SURE TO BRING THEM TO TULSA AND REGISTER THEM ON APRIL 22<sup>nd</sup> IN THE AWARDS AREA. <u>If</u> permitted by your administration.

On Sunday, April 21st Crossland Construction will conduct a tour of the construction site across the street from the Cox Center at 5:00 p.m.be prepared to bring a hard hat.

<u>On Monday April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, there will be a meeting and breakfast from 7:00 – 8:00 a.m. in the Aaronson room at the Tulsa Central Library East of the Convention Center which is also being sponsored by the Tulsa Homebuilders Association and AGC Oklahoma.</u> Resumes will be turned in for the contest at this time and name badges will be handed out.

On Sunday, April 21<sup>st</sup> a meal sponsored by Oklahoma AGC and the Tulsa Homebuilder's Association from 6:00-7:30 p.m. will be held at Baxter's Grill ,717 S Houston Ste 100, Tulsa, OK 74127

The Professional Development test and cabinetmaking written tests will be given online from **March 13 - April 9, 2024**.

#### Contestant resumes are required for each contestant.

All contestants are required to submit a one-page, typed resume at contest. If any contestant does not submit a resume to the contest chair, penalty points will be assessed.

Lunch will be provided for all Judges and Instructors. Contestants can bring lunch, or they will need to bring between 10\$ - 15\$ for lunch.

We will follow the national rules, regulations, and contest content as closely as possible. We want our contestants to be prepared to compete at the national level. All contestants <u>will be</u> required to assist in the clean-up following the judging.

#### **Item 4 – Clothing Requirements**

April 16<sup>th</sup> the day of the skills competition, all students will be required to wear appropriate clothing representative of their occupation. No school logos or anything that shows your name allowed on clothing. **Safety glasses are required at all times while in the contest area.** 

#### Item 5 – Industry Awards

All Cabinetmaking industry awards should be clearly marked so that they will not get mixed up with the TeamWorks and Carpentry contests. Industry awards need to be labeled with the name and address of the award supplier and taken to the Industry Awards check-in at the Tulsa Convention Center Arena on Monday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> (**Only one per contestant**)

#### Item 6 – Awards Ceremony

Contest winners will be recognized during the Awards Assembly at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> in the Tulsa Convention Center Arena. <u>OFFICIAL SkillsUSA ATTIRE IS REQUIRED</u>, according to the <u>SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards</u> – clothing requirements. Any contest winner who is not in official SkillsUSA attire <u>will not</u> be permitted on stage. The student will be escorted behind the stage to receive his or her medallion and/or awards. The awards ceremony is the "Showcase" of our state conference and many industry guests and VIP's are invited to present medallions and honor our students. NO HATS ARE TO BE WORN DURING THE AWARDS CEREMONY.

Note: Only the skills scores will be recorded the day of the contest. The written scores will be computed later, so no one will know where the students have placed from this competition until the day of the awards ceremony in Tulsa on April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

ONLY THE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD PLACE WINNERS WILL BE GOING ON THE STAGE. This will mirror what takes place during the National SkillsUSA Awards Ceremony. Contest winners must have their <u>conference badges</u> in order to pick up their industry prizes.

<u>There will be no awards/prizes for  $4^{th} - 6^{th}$  places from this time forward.</u>

#### <u>Item 7 – Tools and Supplies</u>

Contestants are responsible for the removal of all their contest materials immediately after the judging is completed and the contest chairman releases the projects.

Note: Check with Host Teacher to see what type of hose connections are used with the school's air supply if you are going to use an air nailer.

- 1 each <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 4' x 4' Plywood for work surface
- 1 each Electric Drill or Cordless Drill (with Phillips Head Bits)
- -- -- Assorted Drill Bits Up to ¼" Diameter
- 1 each Electrical Cord
- 1 each Finish Sander
- 1 each Finish Hammer
- 1 each Finish Air Nailer (optional) Air Hose if using Air Nailer
- 1 each Brad Nailer
- 1 each Jig Saw
- 4 each 36" Bar Clamps
- 1 each Nail Set
  - #6 1-1/4" Pocket Screws
  - 1 1/2" Wood Screws
- 1 pint Wood Glue
- 1 pint Wood Filler (color to match selected hardwood)
- 1 lb. #4 Finish Nails or 1-1/2" Air Nailer nails
- -- -- Brad nails
- -- -- Assorted Sandpaper
- 1 each Jig Saw
- 4 each 36" Bar Clamps
- 1 each Nail Set
