

## Carpentry State Contest Information

Tentative-Information is subject to change, check back often.

#### Item 1 – Date, Time and Location

# On Sunday, April 21st Crossland Construction will conduct a tour of the construction site across the street from the Cox Center at 5:00 p.m.be prepared to bring a hard hat.

<u>On Sunday, April 21<sup>st</sup> a meal sponsored by Oklahoma AGC and the Tulsa Homebuilder's</u> Association from 5:30-7:30 p.m. will be held at Baxter's Grill ,717 S Houston Ste 100, <u>Tulsa, OK 74127</u>

<u>On Monday April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024, there will be a meeting and breakfast from 7:00 – 8:00 a.m. in the Aaronson room at the Tulsa Central Library East of the Convention Center which is also being sponsored by the Tulsa Homebuilders Association and AGC Oklahoma.</u>

Crossland Construction, OSUIT, and the Southern Region Carpenters Regional Council will be providing industry judges for the day of the skills competition.

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, contest chairman and judges will need to report to the Tulsa Convention Center at 8:00 a.m. to prepare for contestant briefing.

The PDP written test and *carpentry test* will be given online from Mar 13 - Apr 9, 2024.

All contestant tools and materials will need to be unloaded on April 21st by 4:30 p.m. in the convention center carpentry contest area.

#### Contestant resumes are required for each contestant.

*All contestants* are required to submit a one-page, typed resume. If any contestant does not submit a resume to the contest chair, penalty points will be assessed.

#### Item 2 – Lunch

Lunch will possibly be sponsored but be prepared to purchase lunch for the day of the competition.

#### **Item 3 – Rules and Regulations**

From this competition, a secondary and post-secondary contestant will be selected to represent Oklahoma at the National SkillsUSA competition in Atlanta. Therefore, we will follow the national rules, regulations, and contest content as closely as possible. We want our contestants to be prepared to compete at the national level. <u>All contestants will be required to assist in the clean-up following the judging.</u>

#### **Item 4 – Clothing Requirements**

April 22<sup>nd</sup>, the day of the skills competition, all students will be required to wear appropriate clothing representative of their occupation. <u>Safety glasses and hard hats are required at all time</u> while in the contest area.

#### <u>Item 5 – Industry Awards</u>

All Carpentry contest industry awards should be clearly marked so that the carpentry and cabinetmaking contests prizes are not mixed up.

- Industry awards need to be labeled with the name and address of the award supplier and taken to the Industry Awards check-in at the Tulsa Convention Center Monday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- ALL INSTRUCTORS PARTICIPATING IN THE STATE CONTEST SHOULD ONLY BRING ONE INDUSTRY AWARDS PER REGISTERED CONTESTANT <u>IF PERMITTED BY YOUR ADMINISTRATION.</u>

#### Item 6 – Awards Ceremony

Contest winners will be recognized during the Awards Assembly at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> in the Tulsa Convention Center Arena. <u>OFFICIAL SkillsUSA ATTIRE IS REQUIRED!</u> According to the <u>SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards</u> – clothing requirements. Any contest winner who is not in official SkillsUSA attire <u>will not</u> be permitted on stage. The student will be escorted behind the stage to receive his or her medallion and/or awards. The awards ceremony is the "Showcase" of our state conference, and many industry guests and VIPs are invited to present medallions and honor our students. NO HATS ARE TO BE WORN DURING THE AWARDS CEREMONY.

ONLY THE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD PLACE WINNERS WILL BE GOING ON THE STAGE. This will mirror what takes place during the National SkillsUSA Awards Ceremony. They will need to be wearing their conference name badge in order to be permitted into the awards area to pick up their industry awards/prizes.

No industry prizes/awards will be given to the  $4^{th} - 6^{th}$  places from this time forward.

#### <u> Item 7 – Tools and Equipment</u>

- Cut-resistant Level 3 gloves
- One 8 pt. crosscut saw (10 pt. or 12 pt. optional)
- Claw hammer

- One set chisels (1/4" to 1")
- Framing square
- 16' or longer steel tape measure
- Utility knife with standard blades
- Two pencils

• One each (1 and 2 pt. Phillips and 4" and 8" standard screwdrivers) or one multi-tip with equivalent tip

- Wrecking bar or gooseneck pinch bar
- Coping saw and extra blade
- Cat's paw (nail puller)
- Chalk box and line
- One nail set
- Straight aviation snip or any metal-cutting snips
- 24" or 30" spirit level
- Combination wood rasp and file (8")
- Carpenter's tool and nail pouch with belt and/or suspenders
- Stair gauges
- Combination square and/or speed square
- 25' power cord (UL approved grounded)
- Calculator
- Power circular saw with new carbide-tipped blade
- Drywall saw
- Portable toolbox not to exceed 4.0 cubic feet of storage capacity.
- Screw gun
- Cordless Drill with #2 Phillips tips
- Hardhat
- Safety glasses
