Date, Time and Location

The 2025 SkillsUSA Carpentry contest will be held on Monday, April 28 at the Arvest Convention Center, formally known as the Cox Convention Center. Contest will start at 8am.

- All contestant tools and materials will need to be unloaded on Sunday, April 27th by 4:30 p.m. in the convention center carpentry contest area.
- Sunday, April 28th, 2025 at 5pm meet in the Masonry contest area for industry tour.
- Sunday, April 27th, 2025, a meal sponsored by Oklahoma AGC and the Tulsa Homebuilder's Association from 6:00-7:30 p.m. will be held at Baxter's Grill ,717 S Houston Ste 100, Tulsa, OK 74127
- Monday April 28th, 2025, there will be a meeting and breakfast from 7:00 8:00 a.m. in the Aaronson room at the Tulsa Central Library East of the Arvest Convention Center which is also being sponsored by the Tulsa Homebuilders Association and AGC Oklahoma.

On April 28th, contest chairman and judges will need to report to the Arvest Convention Center at 8:00 a.m. to prepare for contestant briefing.

ONLINE TESTING

Contestants will be judged on their SkillsUSA knowledge through Professional Development test. Testing will be completed online and proctored through their technology centers. Online testing opens March 14, 2025, and closes Apil 4, 2025.

All contestants will submit a digital resume prior to contest day. Contestants will receive an email to the address used to register the contestant for contest with instructions and link to access the SkillsUSA Competitor Portal page. The email will contain contestant's username and contestant number, which are required to login to the Competitor Portal. Deadline to submit resume is **April 22, 2025**. If any contestant does not submit a resume penalty point will be assessed.

Lunch: Lunch will be sponsored by Crossland Contruction Company. Contestants will be able to purchase food at the concession area in the convention center.

Rules and Regulations

From this competition, a secondary and post-secondary contestant will be selected to represent Oklahoma at the National SkillsUSA competition in Atlanta. Therefore, we will follow the

national rules, regulations, and contest content as closely as possible. We want our contestants to be prepared to compete at the national level. <u>All contestants will be required to assist in the clean-up following the judging.</u>

Crossland Construction, OSUIT, and the Southern Region Carpenters Regional Council will be providing industry judges for the day of the skills competition.

Clothing Requirements

April 28th, the day of the skills competition, all students will be required to wear appropriate clothing representative of their occupation. Contestants should not wear clothing that has school or name identification visible to the judges. Those contestants wearing program uniforms will need to cover all identifying patches. *Safety glasses and hard hats are required at all time while in the contest area.*

CELLPHONES AND OTHER SMART DEVICES

Cellphones, electronic watches and/or other electronic devices not approved by a competition's technical committee are NOT allowed in the competition area,

Industry Awards

All Carpentry contest industry awards should be clearly marked so that the carpentry and cabinetmaking contests prizes are not mixed up.

- Industry awards need to be labeled with the name and address of the award supplier and taken to the Industry Awards check-in at the Arvest Convention Center, in Conference Hall across from Exhibit Hall A on Monday, April 28th between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00pm.
- ALL INSTRUCTORS PARTICIPATING IN THE STATE CONTEST SHOULD ONLY BRING ONE INDUSTRY AWARDS PER REGISTERED CONTESTANT <u>IF PERMITTED BY YOUR</u> ADMINISTRATION.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Winners will be recognized at the General Session on Tuesday morning, April 29th, at 9am at the Arvest Convention Center in the Grand Hall.

All competitors must wear official SkillsUSA dress to the Awards Session, where winners are announced. Competitors who are not dressed appropriately or lack official attire will be denied access to the awards stage. Students must be present when their contest is announced. If a student is improperly dressed, absent, or misses their contest being called, the production will not be paused for any reason, and they will forfeit their opportunity to go on stage to receive the award. No exceptions will be made. No hats or sunglasses will be allowed to be worn on stage.

- Official dress for men: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks; white dress shirt; plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA black tie; black socks and black shoes.
- Official dress for women: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks or knee- length skirt with business like white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes

ONLY THE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD PLACE WINNERS WILL BE GOING ON THE STAGE. This will mirror what takes place during the National SkillsUSA Awards Ceremony. They will need

to be wearing their conference name badge in order to be permitted into the awards area to pick up their industry awards/prizes.

No industry prizes/awards will be given to the $4^{th} - 6^{th}$ places from this time forward.

- Cut-resistant Level 3 gloves
- One 8 pt. crosscut saw (10 pt. or 12 pt. optional)
- Claw hammer
- One set chisels (1/4" to 1")
- Framing square
- 16' or longer steel tape measure
- Utility knife with standard blades
- Two pencils
- One each (1 and 2 pt. Phillips and 4" and 8" standard screwdrivers) or one multitip with equivalent tip
- Wrecking bar or gooseneck pinch bar
- Coping saw and extra blade
- Cat's paw (nail puller)
- Chalk box and line
- One nail set
- Straight aviation snip or any metal-cutting snips
- 24" or 30" spirit level
- Combination wood rasp and file (8")
- Carpenter's tool and nail pouch with belt and/or suspenders
- Stair gauges
- Combination square and/or speed square
- 25' power cord (UL approved grounded)
- Calculator
- Power circular saw with new carbide-tipped blade
- Drywall saw
- Portable toolbox not to exceed 4.0 cubic feet of storage capacity.
- Screw gun
- Cordless Drill with #2 Phillips tips
- Hardhat
- Safety glasses
