TIME/DATE/LOCATIONS

The event will be held on Monday, April 28th, 2025, at the Tulsa Tech Riverside Campus in Jenks, OK. Room A155. Contestants must report before 8:00AM for contest check-in and team schedule

TESTING

Contestants will be judged on their SkillsUSA knowledge through the Professional Development test and Cybersecurity Exam knowledge test (comprised of CompTIA Security+ questions). Testing will be completed online and proctored through their technology centers. Online testing opens March 14, 2025, and closes Apil 4, 2025. No provisions are being made for make-up testing on-site.

All contestants will submit a digital resume prior to contest day. Contestants will receive an email to the address used to register the contestant for contest with instructions and link to access the SkillsUSA Competitor Portal page. The email will contain contestant's username and contestant number, which are required to login to the Competitor Portal.

Deadline to submit resume is April 22, 2025

Students will break for lunch at 11:00AM and return at 12 noon, at which time they will resume competition. All contestants will be provided with a box lunch.

INDUSTRY AWARDS

Please bring prizes to the industry awards area at the Arvest Convention Center Conference Hall, Sunday, April 27th between 12-4pm or Monday, April 28th between 8am-4pm.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Winners will be recognized at the General Session on Tuesday morning, April 29th, at 9am. All competitors must wear official SkillsUSA dress to the Awards Session, where winners are announced. Competitors who are not dressed appropriately or lack official attire will be denied access to the awards stage. Students must be present when their contest is announced. If a student is improperly dressed, absent, or misses their contest being called, the production will not be paused for any reason, and they will forfeit their opportunity to go on stage to receive the award. No exceptions will be made. No hats or sunglasses will be allowed to be worn on stage.

- Official dress for men: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks; white dress shirt; plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA black tie; black socks and black shoes.
- Official dress for women: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks or knee length skirt with business like white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes

CONTEST DESCRIPTION

This is a team event consisting of two contestants, each from the same division. Contestants are required to be in official contest attire. The contest Chairperson will be discussing expectations of each team and giving them a contest schedule of events for the competition day during the check-in process on the day of competition. Each contestant will be required to bring his or her printed one page resume that meets contest resume guidelines. It will be presented to the judges upon entry to the contest area. A deduction will be applied to the team's overall score if a resume for each contestant is not submitted to the Judges. Equipment checks will be performed upon entry to the contest area to ensure that all contestants are able to access network for Internet connectivity. This will be required to access certain portions of the competition.

Cybersecurity Professional Activities Interview:

Per changes made at the National SkillsUSA conference, the Cybersecurity Professional Activity will consist of each team member being required to participate in an interview about the cybersecurity industry and industry best practices. Contestants will answer interview questions separately from their teammate. The scores of each team member will be compiled together for a team interview score.

Competition Timeline:

Competition will begin on Monday, April 28, 2025 promptly at 8:00AM at the Tulsa Tech Riverside Campus. Each contestant must present the contest chairperson with their resume at contest check-in. Students will break for lunch at 11:00AM and return at 12 noon, at which time they will resume competition. All contestants will be provided with a box lunch. Competition should be complete by approximately 3:00PM.
