DATE AND LOCATION

The 2025 Oklahoma SkillsUSA Pin Design contest will be held Sunday, April 27th, 2025, and will be hosted at the Arvest Convention Center, Tulsa, OK. Official check-in and contest location will be published in 2025 SLSC Agenda prior to conference.

Contestants must report to the Contest Chairman at the contest area in the 2^{nd} Floor Legacy <u>Hall</u> at 11:00 a.m.

- Students (No Advisors) will have from 11:00 a.m. -1 p.m. to set up Pin Design Displays.
 Display set-up is limited to three students per timeslot.
- Judging and interviews will take place starting at 1:30 p.m.

Students are encouraged to stay with displays to allow viewers to visit between 9 a.m.- 3 p.m. on Monday, April 28th. *This is a great time to showcase the student's talent and an opportunity for students to talk about their school, instructor, program, and the skills.*

Displays must be removed between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday, April 28th.

CONTEST TESTING

Contestants will be judged on their SkillsUSA knowledge through the Professional Development test. Testing will be completed online and proctored through their technology centers. Online testing opens March 14, 2025, and closes Apil 4, 2025.

All contestants will submit a digital resume prior to contest day. Contestants will receive an email to the address used to register the contestant for contest with instructions and link to access the SkillsUSA Competitor Portal page. The email will contain contestants username and contestant number, which are required to login to the Competitor Portal. If any contestant does not submit a resume, penalty points will be assessed.

Deadline to submit resume is April 22, 2025.

LUNCH

Lunch will not be provided for this contest. Contestants will need to eat prior to contest or can purchase snack type items at the Cox Convention Center during contest hours while not competing.

Clothing Requirements

Contestants MUST wear official SkillsUSA dress attire for contest. A clothing penalty will apply for any deviations from official dress. <u>Class A: SkillsUSA Official Attire or Class E: Competition Specific — Business Casual allowed.</u>

CELLPHONES AND OTHER SMART DEVICES

Cellphones, electronic watches and/or other electronic devices not approved by a competition's technical committee are NOT allowed in the competition area. Please follow the guidelines in each technical standard for approved exceptions. Technical committee members may also approve exceptions onsite during the SkillsUSA Championships if deemed appropriate.

CONTEST

Equipment and Materials

- 1. Supplied by the technical committee:
 - a. Table space for each display
 - b. Timekeeper and judges
 - c. All necessary information for the judges and technical committee

2. Supplied by the competitor:

- a. (2) 8.5" x 11" page rendering of pin design with two sizes: 7" and 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (must follow points in Competition Guidelines, including attribution for fair use and proof of creative commons content, or permission to use copyrighted content). One 8.5" x 11" rendering of pin design will be turned into judges.
- b. Tabletop display to promote the pin design to the public
- c. Means of presentation: computer, tablet, notebook, poster, or other media of the competitor's choice, if desired to make the presentation to the judges.
- d. All competitors must create a one-page resume.

AWARDS CEREMONY

Winners will be recognized at the General Session on Monday night, April 28th, at 7pm at the Arvest Convention Center in the Grand Hall.

All competitors must wear official SkillsUSA dress to the Awards Session, where winners are announced. Competitors who are not dressed appropriately or lack official attire will be denied access to the awards stage. Students must be present when their contest is announced. If a student is improperly dressed, absent, or misses their contest being called, the production will not be paused for any reason, and they will forfeit their opportunity to go on stage to receive the award. No exceptions will be made. No hats or sunglasses will be allowed to be worn on stage.

- Official dress for men: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks; white dress shirt; plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA black tie; black socks and black shoes.
- Official dress for women: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks or knee-length skirt with business like white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes.
