Students must report to the Contest Chair in Arvest Convention Center, Tulsa, OK at Ballroom B West at 8:00 a.m. on **Monday, April 28, 2025**.

**Please Note:** The contest will be held indoors at the Convention Center. The contest room features carpeted flooring. All demonstrations must be conducted in a manner that does not cause any damage to the room or its surfaces.

### **RULES and REGULATIONS**

The SkillsUSA (PDP) test will be taken on-line **March 14-April 4th**. All testing must be completed through school testing centers as a proctored test. No provisions are being made for make-up testing on-site.

### **RESUME**

SkillsUSA Oklahoma is excited to announce the new addition of digital resume submissions for this years contests. The change to digital submission will help facilitate a better contest experience. All contestants will submit a digital resume prior to contest day. Contestants will receive an email to the address used to register for the contest with instructions and link to access the SkillsUSA Competitor Portal page. The email will contain contestant's username and contestant number, which are required to login to the Competitor Portal.

Lunch will not be provided for this contest. Contestants will need to eat prior to contest or can purchase snack type items at the Arvest Convention Center during contest hours while not competing.

# **Clothing Requirements**

Each member of the team will be evaluated at the beginning of the contest for official SkillsUSA

dress. According to the SkillsUSA Championships Technical Standards - clothing requirements for the Principles of Engineering contest are:

**For men:** Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks; white dress shirt; plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA black tie; black socks and black shoes.

**For women:** Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks or knee-length skirt with businesslike white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes.

# **Industry Awards**

Industry awards need to be labeled with the name and address of the award supplier and taken to the Industry Awards check-in at the Arvest Convention Center, in Conference Hall on Sunday, April 27th between 12pm-4pm and Monday, April 28th between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00pm.

### **AWARDS CEREMONY**

Winners will be recognized at the General Session on Tuesday morning, April 29<sup>th</sup> at 9am.

All competitors must wear official SkillsUSA dress to the Awards Session, where winners are announced. Competitors who are not dressed appropriately or lack official attire will be denied access to the awards stage. Students must be present when their contest is announced. If a student is improperly dressed, absent, or misses their contest being called, the production will not be paused for any reason, and they will forfeit their opportunity to go on stage to receive the award. No exceptions will be made. No hats or sunglasses will are allowed to be worn on stage.

Official dress for men: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks; white dress shirt; plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA black tie; black socks and black shoes.

Official dress for women: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks or knee-length skirt with business like white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes.
