• Oklahoma "District" Advisor of the Year Applicants

- Each of the six (6) SkillsUSA Oklahoma Districts will select a District Advisor of the Year. Each District Advisor of the Year winner will be recognized during their District Leadership Conference in February.
- o Each District Advisor of the Year will be a Finalist for the Oklahoma State Advisor of the Year.

• Oklahoma Advisor of the Year (AOY) Finalist

- O During SLSC, all AOY Finalist will be interviewed on Sunday, **April 20, 2026** by a selection committee. The SkillsUSA Oklahoma Advisor of the year will be selected by the committee.
- The Oklahoma Advisor of the Year finalist will be invited to attend and be recognized on stage at the General Session of the SkillsUSA Oklahoma Leadership and Skills Conference (SLSC) in Tulsa on April 21, 2026.

• Oklahoma Advisor of the Year Winner - Announced at the State Leadership and Skills Conference

- o The SkillsUSA Oklahoma Advisor of the Year winner will be eligible for the National Advisor of the Year in **2026-27**.
- o To be nominated for National Advisor of the Year, the nominee must complete a Level 2 of the Chapter Excellence Program.



Nominator's Instructions

Nominator should submit to his/her application to SkillsUSA State Advisor:

- Nomination form
- One page Outstanding accomplishments of candidate intentionally integrated the SkillsUSA Framework into your school and chapter efforts



- Two letters of support or recommendation (maximum)

 Note: Information provided in letters of support weighs heavily in evaluation.
- School Administrator recommendation letter. This letter is in addition to the two letters of support as noted above.
- A *digital* color portrait (head and shoulders shot in SkillsUSA attire) of the nominee. *Portraits may be submitted in digital format.*
- No additional materials will be accepted.

Criteria

This award is open to secondary and/or postsecondary educators involved in technical, skilled, and service occupations, including health occupations courses, and who have achieved prominence at local, state, or national levels. One such award will be presented annually.

Eligibility

Eligible individuals are individuals who are currently employed by high schools, post-secondary institutions, career tech schools, etc. Contributions and achievements on which the nomination is based should have been made within the past ten years. The nominee must be a paid SkillsUSA professional member.
