

# 2026 OKLAHOMA SLSC STATE MEMO

## Promotional Bulletin Board

### **DATE AND LOCATION**

The 2026 Oklahoma SkillsUSA Promotional Bulletin Board contest will be held Sunday, April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2026, and will be hosted at the Arvest Convention Center, Tulsa, OK. Official check-in and contest location will be published in 2026 SLSC Agenda prior to conference.

### **CONTEST**

Contest will follow the national rules and regulations and content as closely as possible. We want our contestants to be prepared to compete at the national level. Official outline and technical for Promotional Bulletin Board contest can be found/accessed through Pathful.

- Students who are setting up Bulletin Boards must report to the Promotional Bulletin Board Contest Chair at the second floor of the Legacy Hall at the Arvest Convention Center from 11:00 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Sunday, April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
- Students will have from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. to set up displays. Display set-up is limited to three students per entry (NO ADVISORS ALLOWED). **Binders must be left with the board after setup.**
- Judging will take place starting at 1:30 p.m. Three students for each entry must be present for an interview during the judging.
- Displays will be left up for viewing on Monday, April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
- Students are encouraged to stay with displays to allow viewers to visit them during 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. on Monday. This is a time to showcase the team's talent and an

opportunity for students to talk about their school, instructor, program, and the skills.

- Displays must be removed between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Monday, April 20th. SkillsUSA IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DISPLAYS WHICH ARE NOT PICKED UP BY 5:00 P.M. on Monday.

## **CONTEST TESTING**

Contestants will be judged on their SkillsUSA knowledge through the Professional Development test. Testing will be completed online and proctored through their technology centers. Online testing opens March 16, 2026, and closes April 3, 2026.

## **RESUME- Change to submission type for 2026...please read**

All contestants will submit a digital resume prior to contest day. Contestants will receive an email to the address used to register the contestant for contest with instructions and link to access the SkillsUSA Competitor Portal page. The email will contain contestant's username and contestant number, which are required to login to the Competitor Portal.

Deadline to submit resume is April 3, 2026. All members of the team will be required to submit a resume. If any contestant does not submit a resume, penalty points will be assessed.

## **LUNCH**

Lunch will not be provided for this contest. Contestants will need to eat prior to contest or can purchase snack type items at the Arvest Convention Center during contest hours while not competing.

## **CLOTHING REQUIREMENTS**

Contestant will follow official contest dress as described in the national technical. Students cannot wear any identifying information on their official dress that will associate them with a school or technology center.

## **CELLPHONES AND OTHER SMART DEVICES**

Cellphones, electronic watches and/or other electronic devices not approved by a competition's technical committee are NOT allowed in the competition area. Please follow the guidelines in each technical standard for approved exceptions. Technical committee members may also approve exceptions onsite during the SkillsUSA Championships if deemed appropriate.

## **AWARDS CEREMONY**

Winners will be recognized at the General Session on Monday night, April 20th, at 7pm at the

Arvest Convention Center in the Grand Hall.

**All competitors must wear official SkillsUSA dress to the Awards Session, where winners are announced. Competitors who are not dressed appropriately or lack official attire will be denied access to the awards stage. Students must be present when their contest is announced. If a student is improperly dressed, absent, or misses their contest being called, the production will not be paused for any reason, and they will forfeit their opportunity to go on stage to receive the award. No exceptions will be made. No hats or sunglasses will be allowed to be worn on stage.**

- Official dress for men: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks; white dress shirt; plain black tie with no pattern or SkillsUSA black tie; black socks and black shoes.
- Official dress for women: Official blazer, jacket or sweater; black dress slacks or knee-length skirt with business like white, collarless blouse or white blouse with small, plain collar that may not extend onto the lapels of the blazer, and black dress shoes.
